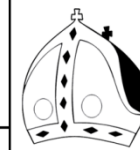

Failure to do so will result in being unable progress into Yr. 13 a pre-requisite of being in the sixth form is to complete EPQ. The deadline for the written report is the end of the summer term of Yr 12. Failure to complete this leads to failing Yr12. smoking and anti-social behaviour on or near to the school site is forbidden.
